

## Bob and Vicki Andersen Scholarship - Gretna High School

The purpose of the Fund is to encourage, solicit, receive and distribute a scholarship in support of Gretna graduating student who is attending trade school. Every year the donors will distribute a \$1,000 scholarship based on the recommendation of the Selection Committee at the Gretna School District which will be a one-time and non-renewable gift to the student.

The donor would like Midlands Community Foundation Selection Committee make the recommendation for the scholarship recipient and alternate. <u>The due dates on the Selection Committee Report and Evaluation will change to meet your timeline at Gretna High School</u>. These dates are preliminary until I have confirmed dates from you.

To qualify for the scholarship, a student must fit within the following charitable class:

a. Must be a current, graduating senior.

Selection of the scholarship recipient shall be made from the qualifying applicants of the above-identified charitable class, based on the following criteria:

- a. The applicant must show financial need.
- b. Applicant has been accepted to a trade school (a copy of acceptance letter must be attached).
- c. Applicant must have work experience (include employer(s) name and year(s) employed)
- d. A letter from the school office stating that the applicant has passing and /or satisfactory grades to graduate.
- e. Applicant can't be convicted of a drug/alcohol offense.
- f. Submission of the application by the deadline date.

The definition of trade school defined by my donors is stated below:

A trade school is a school that focuses on providing graduates with marketable skills. Common examples include but not limited to; esthetician colleges, cosmetology schools, culinary schools, automotive repair training programs, welding program, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) program, electrical program, and training for medical technicians. After graduating from such a school, an individual will be able to enter the job market with his or her skills and work with an organization that recognizes the certification/diploma.
